Playing Career Summary:

Richard started his rugby career at his hometown club Neath before a stint in Australia brought him to the attention of the Cardiff Blues. Richard closed out his rugby career at the Llanelli Scarlets and was a part of the squad that went on to win the Guinness Pro 12 Championship in 2017.

New Career: Investment Management

During his playing career Richard was focused on his post rugby transition and continued his academic endeavours, this culminated in Richard gaining a Ph.D. in Engineering during the latter stages of his time in Welsh rugby.
