CASE STUDY: CRICKET to PROPERTY

Name: Tom Jewell and Chris Tremlett **Age:** 30 and 39
From: Reading and Southampton

Playing Career Summary:

Although they crossed paths playing for Surrey at the Kia Oval for a number of years, Tom and Chris' respective careers in professional cricket followed very different trajectories. The former made just 17 combined first-class and List A appearances over a five-year period, whilst Tremlett retired with 459 first-class wickets to his name, enjoying a notable career highlight when playing a key role in England's victorious 2010-11 Ashes campaign down under.

New Career: Property Investment

Support from Player Association:

Though they have not relied on the PCA for support during their career transition journey, Jewell and Tremlett shared their property experience with younger Association members at the PCA's annual Futures Conference in November 2019.
