Playing Career Summary:

Andy spent his entire playing career with his hometown club. He made his debut for Gloucester Rugby as a replacement during the 1997/98 Premiership season and went on to make more than 250 appearances for the club as well as earning seven caps for England. He was forced to retire with immediate effect in February 2014 due to concussion.

New Career: Entrepreneur

Towards the latter stages of his career, Andy became committed to learning about e-commerce and setting up his businesses. Andy worked closely with the RPA, which helped him get his businesses off the ground, but also allowed him to become a mentor to current players who are exploring their options.
